We are delighted to announce the appointment of The Venerable Nikki Groarke, the Archdeacon of Dudley, as a Trustee and Non-Executive Member of the Chapter of Worcester Cathedral.

Worcester Classics

On Saturday 22 August at 5.30 pm, The Ramsey Singers will sing a service of Choral Evensong with music composed entirely by former organists of Worcester Cathedral. The canticles will be the Third or ‘Great’ Service by Thomas Tomkins, widely considered to be his masterpiece, while the anthem will be the rarely performed verse anthem from his 1668 collection *Musica Deo Sacra*: ‘Almighty God which hast knit together thine elect.’ The responses and

psalms will feature settings by more recent Worcester organists Donald Hunt, Adrian Lucas and Peter Nardone while the organ voluntary will be 'Processional' by Sir David Willcocks. The choir will be directed by current lay clerk Dr Mark Fenton and the organ will be played by former Sub-Assistant Organist Dr Ed Jones.
