Consultation on Carbon Reduction Projects

Members of the public and the Cathedral community are invited to meet with our Cathedral Architect to discuss the proposals to deliver a series of carbon reduction projects, to help with the Church of England's ambition to reach net-zero by 2030:

- ❖ changing the heat source for the underfloor system in the Chapter House from the gas boilers to Air Source Heat Pumps (ASHPs);
- ❖ installation of a photo-voltaic (PV) array to the structures in the yard;
- ❖ and, longer term, to instal PV arrays to south facing roofs of the cathedral and buildings around the cloister and upgrade the electrical supply to the precinct by introducing a new substation.

The consultation display will be in the Chapter House on Wednesday 21 January and staff will be on hand to answer queries from 1.30 pm to 7.30 pm.

St Oswald's Hospital, Worcester – Almshouses available

St Oswald's Hospital is an ancient foundation of almshouses, located in central Worcester at The Tything, Worcester, Worcestershire WR1 1HR. It is comprised of 21 Grade II listed almshouses, a chapel and gardens and the aim of St Oswald's Hospital is to provide high quality homes in a safe, secure and friendly environment, with a strong sense of community. Each of the almshouses is self-contained and consists of a living room, a bedroom, a kitchen and a bathroom and there are currently spaces available for new residents.

Worcester Saints

Tomorrow we celebrate one of Worcester's most revered saints. Born in about the year 1009, St Wulfstan's first twenty-five years after his ordination was spent in the monastery at Worcester. Against his will, he was elected Bishop of Worcester in 1062 but went on to prove an able administrator and pastor. He carefully and gently nurtured both church and state through the transition from Saxon to Norman rule. He died at Worcester on this day in the year 1095.
