

Services and Music March 2023

This month, we enter Lent: 40 days of prayer and discipline, that echoes the 40 days Jesus spent in the wilderness at the start of his ministry. 'The wilderness' is a weighty image in Christian tradition. It can carry with it echoes of everything from the chaos which God orders at the start of creation, to the years of Israel's wandering through the desert, to the places of desolation that were known in exile. It is a place of unpredictability and danger, vast open spaces, traversed with time to feel our fear.

Sometimes, the wilderness we need is a wilderness of silence and solitude, where we can detach from the voices that clamour for our attention to better hear the voice of God. But that is not our only option. In Mark's gospel, Jesus' time in the wilderness is not spent in solitude at all, but surrounded by wild beasts and ministering angels. The world Jesus enters for those forty days is one in which human beings are only peripheral, but the rich diversity of the created order is fully present. And it is there, surrounded by beasts and angels, that Jesus grounds himself in his call as the beloved Son: the one born to manifest God's love, the one who will walk to the cross rather than abuse his power.

It may be that God calls you into solitude this Lent, and that silence is what you need to better hear the voice of God. But consider — God may also send you foxes, feathered things, and a sudden rustle of leaves. The wild beasts and angels are sometimes given us to help us know our place: as created being, as occasionally peripheral, as beloved.
