Funeral of Brian Ferris

Brian passed away peacefully on 3 December, aged 92 years. His funeral will be held at St Stephen's, Barbourne at 12 noon on Tuesday 6 January.

He attended several schools during the war years before attending Worcester College for the Blind, due to his extremely poor sight. He became a building surveyor/estimator, joining the family business. When he sold the business in 1987, he relocated to Worcester, where he played an active part in the life of the cathedral, becoming a guide and a keen supporter of the choral tradition. Choral Evensong was his favourite service; whilst he was physically able, he attended on a daily basis. He was a very active member of the Worcester Archaeological Society, for whom he arranged many outings and talks. Despite his sight he was a keen photographer, amassing a large collection of architectural slides, primarily focussed on the ecclesiastical buildings of Great Britain and Europe. He was always ready to share his vast knowledge. He is survived by his children, Michael and Nicola, and grandchildren Samuel, Benjamin, Edward and Amy, all of whom live in and around the Worcester area, as well as his ex-wife Margaret, with whom he remained great friends.

Installation of Prof. Lynn Nichol as Lay Canon

All are warmly welcome to join us for Evensong at 5.30 pm on Thursday 8 January when we will formally install Professor Lynn Nichol as Senior Non-Executive Member of Chapter.

Lynn has worked in higher education for over 30 years. She currently works at the University of Worcester where she is Professor of Human Resource Development and Director of Researcher Development and Doctoral Education. She has been an elected member of the Church of England's General Synod since 2021 and is a member of Bishop's Council.

Lynn has lived within the Diocese of Worcester since 1998, living in Powick and Malvern as well as the Black Country. She is married to David, a recently retired Anglican priest, and they have two adult children. They have returned to living in Malvern again and worship at Great Malvern Priory.

If Lynn isn't doing any of the above she will more than likely be walking some long distance path (current project the South-West Coastal Path), gardening, singing with a community choir or playing the piano very badly.
