Help inform diocesan synod discussion

At the next Diocesan Synod meeting on 30 June, there will be a discussion of the 'Living in Love and Faith' process, including the proposed stand-alone services of blessing on same-sex couples and pastoral reassurance for congregations whose theological convictions on such matters might differ from their bishop's. To aid these deliberations, the Diocese wishes to hear also from those with a wide range of views who are not currently members of the Synod, so has prepared a confidential online survey which may be filled out at <https://forms.office.com/e/qipzkzvt8q> Chapter have already agreed their willingness to offer such prayers of blessing in the Cathedral, so far as they are currently permitted.

Worcester Saints – Richard of Chichester (Monday 16 June)

Richard of Wyche was born near Droitwich in 1197. After a distinguished scholarly career, which culminated with his appointment as Chancellor of Oxford University in 1235, he joined his old tutor (Saint) Edmund of Abingdon, now Archbishop of Canterbury, in political exile in France and nursed him through his final illness. King Henry III opposed Richard's election as Bishop of Chichester in 1244 and sequestered his bishopric's revenues; Richard therefore walked barefoot through his diocese, staying with a village priest, and continued this austere lifestyle even after Henry was forced to recognise his appointment. Canonised nine years after his death in 1253, his shrine in Chichester Cathedral was destroyed at the Reformation, but re-established in 1930. Only the opening three lines of the prayer popularly associated with him go back to a Latin prayer Richard is recorded as having uttered on his death-bed; the memorable rhyming

triplet 'may I know thee more clearly, love thee more dearly, follow thee more nearly' is of twentieth-century origin.
