### Christian Aid Week 10–16 May

Christian Aid's vision is to eradicate poverty. Made in God's image, we're all worthy of dignity, respect and the freedom to live life in abundance as God intends, not in poverty, misery and marginalisation.

This year's Christian Aid Week theme is 'Faithful Action'. Practical, faithful, life-transforming action is highlighted in the stories of Fridah and Belinda, two women supporting their families in Nairobi, where people face extraordinary hardship. Kenya spends more on repaying debt than on public services like health and education.
