### The protection of an iconic building

# Worcester Cathedral has rightly been called one of England's most important and interesting cathedrals.

Founded in the year 680, it has grown over time and now features examples from every period of English cathedral architecture – from very early Saxon, through English Gothic, to some of the best examples of Victorian restoration.

Today, while the building is still strong, its age necessitates almost constant repair and upkeep. Our in-house team of stonemasons and carpenters continue to support and maintain the building and lend their skills to other ancient properties around the country.

Worcester Cathedral also supports apprenticeships in stonemasonry to ensure traditional heritage skills and techniques are passed down through the generations.






These words from the First Book of Chronicles summarise our Christian giving – an offering of thanksgiving. Many people choose to support the Cathedral with a regular gift as their Christian offering – part of their relationship with God and a way to support his ministry in this place.

Worcester Cathedral is first and foremost a church – a place that has been a home of prayer and worship for more than fourteen centuries. A regular gift will support both the rhythm of worship and the fabric of the building, allowing

us to keep the Cathedral open, well lit and warm in the colder months. It will also support the Cathedral's ministry, witness and worship every day of the year.







We have a long and proud musical history. The current Cathedral Choir of boy and girl choristers is the direct descendant of the monastic choir, and there has been singing here almost consistently since we were founded in 680. We also have a voluntary choir (founded in the 1870s), a youth choir (founded in 2021) and a mixed adult chamber choir (founded in 1998) – all wonderful opportunities for music making.

Worcester Cathedral is also one of three Cathedrals that host the Three Choirs Festival – the longeststanding non-competitive classical musical festival in the world, now over 300 years old and synonymous with the UK's great composers such as Edward Elgar, Ralph Vaughan Williams and Gustav Holst.





#### To preserve a vital hub for our community

The Cathedral has a powerful role as a centre of community engagement, working to provide learning, education, and friendship for many.

The Cathedral itself is widely used by local people and visitors alike. We are a welcoming home for all those who wish to come and meet loved ones, have a meal in the Cloister Café or simply sit for a few moments of peace.

Our outreach work connects the Cathedral with a range of social groups and our award-winning learning programme reaches hundreds of schoolchildren every year. The stunning Medieval Library, which is open for tours, houses medieval manuscripts and books collected from the 7th century to the present day.

Worcester Cathedral has laid out an inspiring vision to be a catalyst for campaigning and raising awareness on both the environment and social justice issues.






