## **Immediate Changes to Parking on College Yard**

The work on the new landscaping project for College Yard, beginning in the new year, will require a strict control of parking to allow for the construction phase and safety of all who use the north side of the Cathedral. As well as this exciting development the next few weeks increase footfall considerably on College Yard – starting with the extremely busy Victorian Fair this week and then all our Advent and Christmas events.

As a result of this College Yard will now be unavailable for parking apart from residents and emergency vehicles – the gates will be locked. To assist with the introduction of this new system there will be two attendants at the College Yard gates this Sunday 3 December to help those arriving for services, but from then on please note there will be no vehicular access to College Yard.
