Friends Trustees

The Friends of Worcester Cathedral is seeking to elect new Trustees and Officers at its Annual General Meeting in October 2026. Many of our present Trustees have already served the charity for the maximum term of office permitted by our constitution and must now stand down, giving rise to several vacancies for new Trustees. There is no specific profile for a person to be a Trustee other than a commitment to and enthusiasm for the work that the Friends do: the greater the range of skills and enthusiasms that people bring to the task, the better for the future development of the Friends.

Briefly, the Friends is an independent registered charity with the sole charitable purpose of raising funds to distribute to the cathedral by way of grants to assist in all aspects of its work. Many in the congregation, and far beyond, will be aware of this work and will have enjoyed the many social and cultural events organized by the Friends as part of its fundraising efforts. Founded in 1931 it has so far contributed £1,956,743 to cathedral funds, and is financially well-placed for this work to continue. Trustees collectively oversee the work of the charity, ensuring it operates within charity regulations and our own constitution, but many also make valuable individual contributions to administration, organization of events, communications and publicity activity, and so on.
