Consultation on the Cathedral's Future Sustainability

Chapter has begun a consultation about how we secure the Cathedral's long-term financial sustainability in the face of rising running and maintenance costs. As an independent charity responsible for funding our own ministry and the care of this building, we must plan responsibly for the future. This consultation explores whether visitor income might play a stronger role within a wider sustainability plan, including the potential introduction of a charged entry fee for visitors. No decisions have been taken. Our vocation as a place of worship remains unchanged, and access for prayer and services is not under review. Members of the Cathedral community will receive further information by email, including a link to the Dean's video message and the consultation survey.

Chris Guy

Chris Guy, our Cathedral Archaeologist for 33 years, died on 23 February. Chris served Worcester Cathedral for more than three decades, holding the first full time Cathedral Archaeologist post in the country from 1990 until his retirement in 2023, following a severe stroke. His work included the Chapter House floor excavations (2003–2004), which revealed an Anglo-Saxon cemetery; the College Hall excavations (2019–2020) which, after generations of conjecture, located parts of the Anglo-Saxon Cathedral; emergency research following the fall of a pinnacle during Storm Arwen (2021) to enable repair work. Chris shared his discoveries widely—through reports, journal articles, public talks, and the much-loved annual Archaeological Symposium. His impact extended far beyond archaeology: as the Cathedral's semi-official in-house photographer, he documented countless moments of life at Worcester Cathedral, including at least two royal visits. Chris was a remarkable man—immensely knowledgeable, intellectually curious, and gifted in his craft. Yet it was his warmth, generosity, and humility that endeared him to colleagues. Chris's contribution to the story of Worcester Cathedral is immeasurable. His work—both seen and unseen—will continue to guide future generations. May he rest in peace. His funeral will be held at 1pm on Monday 23 March, here in the Cathedral.
