Confirmation of Bishop's Election

Bishop Hugh Nelson's election as our new bishop was confirmed at a legal ceremony at the church of St Mary le Bow on Friday. He is therefore now Bishop of Worcester, but Bishop Martin will continue to serve as Acting Bishop until Bishop Hugh's official start in the diocese with a service of welcome here in the Cathedral at 2 pm on Saturday 17 January.
