At the next Diocesan Synod meeting on 30 June, there will be a discussion of the 'Living in Love and Faith' process, including the proposed stand-alone services of blessing on same-sex couples and pastoral reassurance for congregations whose theological convictions on such matters might differ from their bishop's. To aid these deliberations, the Diocese wishes to hear also from those with a wide range of views who are not currently members of the Synod, so has prepared a confidential online survey which may be filled out at <u>https://forms.office.com/e/qipzkzvt8q</u> Chapter have already agreed their willingness to offer such prayers of blessing in the Cathedral, so far as they are currently permitted.

Faith in Crime Fiction

From the Golden Age to current day, crime fiction has drawn upon Christian stories and themes such as justice, redemption, innocence, and the prophetic voice; some of these books even feature a clerical detective. Canon Georgina Byrne, formerly a Residentiary Canon here in Worcester and now teaching Christian doctrine and contextual theology at The Queen's Foundation, Birmingham is also (writing as Georgina Clarke) the acclaimed author of the Lizzie Hardwicke mysteries set in 18th-century London and *The Dazzle of the Light*—which was inspired by the Forty Thieves, a gang of notorious female thieves in East London—and will be giving a talk about her novels, faith in crime fiction and also what religious people—vicars, priests, monks and nuns—*actually* do and why they might make good sleuths. 7 pm, Monday 30 June in the Old Palace.
